

BACKGROUND


Cyprus is the third largest island in the Mediterranean Sea, became an independent Republic in 1960 and has a total number of 904705 inhabitants

The suicide rate (per 100,000 inhabitants, 2020): 1.61 for women and 5.34 for men. The highest suicide rate was among men aged 55-59. In women, the age-group with the highest suicide rates was 45-55.

Level of Implementation – National Level

in Government Controlled Areas. The Republic of Cyprus has been a member of the European Union since 2004. The mental health care in the Republic of Cyprus is financed and secured by both the General Healthcare System and the State and is regulated under the Mental Health law (1997). In 2022, there were 31 suicides in Cyprus (24 men and 7 women).
